1 CURRICULUM REFORMS

The process of curriculum reforms, and especially rationalization of programmes, has progressed well and the report is being finalized for consideration by Senate. The process; guided by the Universities Act 2012; University Regulations, 2014; CUE Standards and Guidelines 2014, has been sufficiently collegial. 2 1ST SEMESTER EXAMINATIONS

1st Semester examinations, conducted largely online, have progressed very well and are now coming to an end. This is to advice that we support students who may have encountered challenges to undertake special examination during the next examination session. In the meantime, there is need to complete marking and grading within the stipulated four (4) weeks.

3 COMMENCEMENT OF 2ND SEMESTER

The second semester commenced on 1st February 2021. 1st year students in the College of Humanities and Social Sciences (CHSS) have now reported for On-campus Learning. Senate approved adoption of blended learning whereby Online classes will continue in combination with limited face - face sessions where necessary. During this time, Staff and Students should remain vigilant with respect to COVID - 19 containment Guidelines and Protocols prescribed by the Government of Kenya and the Ministry of Health.
